 - Economics: the average visitor visa holder contributes 12x GDP
 - Culture societal capital: WHV have right mix of skills to allow for efficient operation of our labour markets - enhancing our work streams.

 - WHV's: Target govt now for expansion of the scheme in line with countries we can bubble up with. Due to capped countries like Singapore, Hong Kong, China and Taiwan.
 - Leverage our MOUs for this. TNZ to inform around new markets, HNZ and TIA to truck and trailer the delivery to an all govt approach not just the tourism minister.
 - Touching on the recovery project: Story board phase current, engage stakeholders for data and insight delivery around assumptions, deliver first piece of the project early 2022 around one capital vs all four capitals.
 - Take heed of government be leaders and good citizens. Lead by example and get jabbed and educate staff and others to do this now
 - High vaccination levels will mean the best chance of border reopening in the new year and a return to positive cash flow.
